Evidence Searching

What is an evidence search?

An evidence search is a detailed and organised, step by step search for all the material available on a topic.

Why would I want one?

A Literature Search can support you in many aspects of work and CPD. Perhaps you are working on a service development project or audit, maybe you are writing a presentation or publication? You could be involved in commissioning a service or just want more information about a condition, or a new drug or therapy. An evidence search can provide you with the information you need for this, and will save you the time of having to do it for yourself.

What do you search?

It depends on the topic you want us to search for. We will look on all the relevant medical databases such as Medline,

Embase, Emcare, CINAHL,
Pubmed etc and any specialist
resources that are relevant to
your subject. We can also widen
the search when there are no
obvious specific resources for
that topic, searching Google
and other grey literature
resources when required.
We leave no stone unturned!



How long will it take?

We ask for 10 days' notice, just in case we're really busy or your search is very complex, but we are usually much faster than that.

How do I ask for one?

DISCOVERY

quickly search the library
catalogue, our online journal
collection and free online
resources all in one quick easy
search, rather than having to



look in lots of different places. To do a basic search, just enter your search terms into the Discovery search box on our homepage at:

You will still need to log in to your OpenAthens account to view online journal articles. Look for the OpenAthens log in link on your Discovery Results page.

CRITICAL APPRAISAL

Want to improve your critical appraisal skills, or interested in running a journal club but aren't sure where to start?

The Clinical Librarian can provide tailored critical appraisal training and help advise on setting up and running journal clubs.

The training can be anything from a brief overview to a full three hour sessions (either all at once or over a number of weeks). The depending on time and your requirements the sessions will cover topics such as using checklists to help you structure your appraisal and ask the right questions when you read, identifying bias and methodological flaws in research design, a basic introduction to understanding some of the more useful statistics and practical appraisal of a selected journal article of interest.
