

How to Access your Online Journals

You have **full text** access to **thousands** of online journals via NHS OpenAthens



If you haven't already got an OpenAthens account you can register for one (free of charge) from here:-

<https://openathens.nice.org.uk/>

To access your journals, go to <https://journals.nice.org.uk/>

And then log in to OpenAthens with your username and password

Use the search box to enter the title (or part of the title) of the journal you want to find, or the subject you are interested in.

Or you can use the alphabet menu to look at all the journal titles beginning with a specific letter

The results will show you what journals are available to you, which issues/dates you can access (and whether there is an embargo from the publisher) and links to access the journal from.

Annual Library and Knowledge Service Questionnaire - RESULTS

The results of our first ever Library and Knowledge Service Questionnaire are in and our prize draw winner has been selected.

We are delighted to have received 148 responses in total, so a big thankyou to everyone who filled in a questionnaire.

We are currently looking through all the results and feedback that you have given us and will be using this to develop the service we provide.

We were pleased to have responses from a wide range of different users as well as from 59 people who have not used the Library and Knowledge Service at all in the past 12 months. This is because we want to know who isn't using it and what the barriers to our service are.

We also asked which of our resources and services people are using and will be using your responses to prioritise or marketing and training throughout 2020

And finally we asked a number of questions about our website as many of our users work in the community and access our services online.

We are currently working on updating and improving our website and our using your survey responses to help us with this. If all goes to plan there will be a new and improved Library and Knowledge Service website ready for you to use in the first half of next year.

More detailed results from the survey will be published in the next issue of this newsletter.




Did you know...?


