Don't worry if you don't have MS Teams we can send you a link that will enable you to download guest access for our session


We can provide all our usual training including how to do a literature search and how to access and use our online resources.

Knowledge Alerts



You can now personalise the Knowledge Alerts that you receive.

Once you have opened the Knowledge Alert page you will be given the option to log in with your **NHS OpenAthens** Account. (If you don't yet have one, you can register here:

<https://openathens.nice.org.uk/>

Once logged in you will initially see items from all of the categories, but by clicking on **Customise your account** you can select the topics that you want to view for example:

Older People, Primary Care: General Practice and Public Health.

Once you have saved your profile, the next time you log in to the Knowledge Alerts you will only see the topics that you selected. You can change these at any time, by going back to the **customise your account** page

While you are tailoring your content you can also choose whether to receive email alerts, informing you of when any new items are added to your topics. You can choose to receive these emails on a **daily, weekly** or **monthly** basis. Or you can select **never** if you prefer to just look at the Knowledge Alerts via our webpage.
