



Using the library catalogue

You don't need to come into the library to see if we stock a book or journal that you want, you can now search our catalogue online.

The catalogue contains books and journals that we keep in our library and also e-books that you can access electronically.

To borrow books you need to be a member of the library. If you are not a member you can join by completing the membership form here <https://www.knowledge-nw.nhs.uk/join-the-library>. You will be sent a **Reader ID** and **Library PIN** which you will need to view your Library Account and also request articles.

To access e-books and journals you will need an **NHS OpenAthens ID**. If you don't already have one, you can register for one by going to www.knowledge-nw.nhs.uk/register and clicking on **Register with NHS OpenAthens**.

ACCESSING THE CATALOGUE

To access the catalogue please click on the **Library Icon** on your Trust computer or from any other computer (or if your Trust computer doesn't have the Library icon) go to www.knowledge-nw.nhs.uk and then scroll down and click on **Search the catalogue**.

SEARCHING THE CATALOGUE

To search the catalogue using the **Simple Search**, enter the Keywords and then click on **Search** (magnifying glass).

SEARCH RESULTS

Your results will be displayed 20 to a page, with basic information—the title, author, whether it is available or on loan and what type it is i.e. book or e-book. Most **books** have an abstract which can be viewed by clicking on the **title** of the book. If the book is available and you want to request it, put a tick in the box to the left of it (you can borrow up to 8 books) and once you've finished going through your results click on the **Request** link on the right hand side. If the book is on loan, then you can reserve it by clicking on the **Reserve Button** towards the bottom of the screen. **When requesting books, if you're not logged in, please make sure you add your name and the full address of where you would like them posting to or whether you will collect from the library.**

E-BOOKS

If the book is an E-Book (indicated under **Medium** on the Search Results screen), you can access it from any computer using your **NHS OpenAthens ID**. Click on the title and on the next screen, look for the **Associated** field. In that field you will see a link, click on the link and on the next screen type in your NHS OpenAthens ID and password.

LIBRARY ACCOUNT

To get the most out of the catalogue we recommend that you login before using it. Once logged in, you can then access your account. From there you can renew your books (this must be done before they are due back); check and cancel any reservations you may have and view your loan history — this can help with references for books you may have loaned for study etc.

NB: The screen may show that you are not logged in, click on Search and your details will appear.
