The LKS offers a wide range of resources and services to all staff and students within the Halton, Knowsley and St Helens areas. To find out more, please take a look at our website or get in touch with us.

The library itself is located in <u>Nightingale House</u> and can be accessed 24 hours a day by members. <u>Register</u> to join the library and create an NHS OpenAthens account to access all our online resources.

During the pandemic lockdowns we were still able to provide all our services and even introduced virtual training sessions. Most of our resources are available online and any that aren't, we can send out to you.

For those who would like to come into the library, contact us to apply for 24-hour access and access it whenever it's convenient for you.

In addition, you can sign up for our <u>Knowledge Alerts</u> which bring the latest evidence, news and guidance in your specialty to your desktop or mobile device. You will need to <u>register for an</u> <u>OpenAthens account</u> if you don't already have one.

Although we're unable to provide a physical library at St Helens, we've made sure that we still offer the same quality of service. Most of our resources and services are available online via our website, offered virtually, or can be posted out to you.

We also have an <u>Outreach Librarian</u> who will be happy to come and visit you – for training, assisted evidence searches or just to chat about how we can help you.

Inform GP and GP trainees about relevant books and literature searches

Our <u>Outreach Librarian</u> can provide induction or training sessions to tell you about our services and resources – in person or virtually.

We regularly send out our <u>Outreach newsletter</u> which provides information on services and resources for primary care.

Yes, we offer group or individual <u>training</u> sessions on searching the databases, tailored to your needs. For convenience we can offer them virtually as well as in person. We also provide an <u>Evidence Search</u> service where we can do the searching for you or assist you to do your own search.

Our collection of e-books is growing and we're always pleased to receive any suggestions or recommendations for titles. Titles include clinical books, CPD and leadership subjects, a diversity and inclusion collection as well as the full collection of Oxford handbooks.
